

ABOUT THE PROJECT

1-69 Finish Line is the sixth and final section of the Interstate 69 connection between Evansville and Indianapolis. It begins in Martinsville and ends in Indianapolis.



The project will upgrade the existing State Road 37 to interstate standards from Martinsville to Indianapolis.

The project will eliminate at-grade crossings, construct overpasses and underpasses, build local access road connections and introduce interstate access points throughout the corridor.



The I-69 extension is the realization of 75 years of studies and discussion about an improved, multi-lane highway connecting southwest Indiana.



When work is complete, I-69 will run continuously from the Canadian border at Port Sarnia, MI to Evansville, IN, with Indiana an important piece of the planned national corridor.

TRAFFIC

- I-69 Finish Line is expected to open to traffic in late 2024, improving safety and reducing travel time.
- Highways will be widened to keep traffic flowing into the future. At least one lane will be added in each direction for I-69 from Smith Valley Road to I-465 and on the southwest leg of I-465 between I-70 and I-65.
- The average time it takes to travel from Martinsville to Indianapolis is expected to be reduced by 11 minutes when I-69 is complete.
- > The improvements are expected to result in 1,300 fewer regional crashes each year.
- Traffic will access the new highway using entrance and exit ramps at 10 interchanges.
- New local roads will help provide access to neighboring homes and businesses.
- > The project will improve bicycle and pedestrian connections across the highway.



ECONOMIC IMPACTS

- Governor Holcomb's Next Level Connections program fully funded the \$1.5 billion project and accelerated construction by three years.
- The project is expected to generate \$4.1 billion in positive regional economic impact over 20 years.





CONSTRUCTION

- Construction began in Martinsville in 2019 and the corridor will be delivered in five separate construction contracts.
- The last and largest contract includes improvements and added capacity to I-465 on the southwest side of Indianapolis from approximately I-70 to I-65.
- Crews will work to maintain access for residents and businesses as new traffic patterns are put in place.

BY THE NUMBERS

- > More than 26 miles of new interstate highway will be constructed as part of I-69 Finish Line.
- More than 35 new lane miles of local access roads will be built.
- ▶ I-69 Finish Line includes 39 new bridges and 35 existing bridges will be rehabilitated or replaced.
- ▶ I-69 Finish Line will eliminate 14 traffic signals, leading to a faster and more efficient commute.
- > The project includes 14 new overpasses and underpasses.
- Crews will lay more than 3 million square yards of new pavement.
 That would equate to pavement covering about 469 football fields.
- Enough dirt and stone will be excavated and moved to fill Bankers Life Fieldhouse more than 20 times. That's nearly 3 million pickup truck loads.
